

Bilateral relations through common research and innovation – challenge or joy? by Evija Pudane*

Small domestic market is a major challenge for the most of Latvian companies, directing them to become more global and to take up the challenge and compete in global economy.

Talented, creative, analytical and ambitious are the crucial characteristics of successful business owners in a small economy like Latvia.

The effectiveness of bilateral relations is determined by a mutual wish to learn, build good relationships and structure future cooperation opportunities. Everyone of us wish to do our international activities in a proper manner and in a highly effective way, gaining valuable and appropriate contacts, meeting open minded people and exploring new perspectives on global economy. Successful collaboration is based on complementary knowledge of the involved parties.

"To get more value than expected" is the highest aim for any our activity, but how to achieve this? What we should do to meet people sharing the same life values, business culture and commercial interests? In our CLEANTECH LATVIA team we are delighted to sharing our interests on new global business development, open innovation promotion and industrial competiveness. We can support partners on global expansion by finding ways to expand to new international markets; product innovation by promoting collaboration opportunities on product design and development process and strong partnerships by creating new international partnerships and knowledge transfer.

Collaboration opportunities are also proved by our main academic partner and one of the leading universities of Latvia – Riga Technical University. Earlier this year the Latin American and Caribbean Centre was established. Students from Peru, Brazil, Mexico, Honduras and Panama are ready to study in Riga, mostly choosing the technical sciences. More collaboration options like summer schools with tailored programme on environmental issues are on the negotiation process.

The discussion on activities for deepening the bilateral relations between Latvia and LAC countries is on the schedule of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. They regularly organize political consultations with the Latin American countries, expanding the non-resident ambassador range, planning to open first embassy in the region - Brazil - until 2020, expanding the legal framework. There have been appointed honorary consuls in almost all of Latin America countries, and the Parliament has established parliamentary co-operation group for partnership activities with some Latin American countries, but one of the most important aspects for all the previous mentioned activities is relatively large Latvian diaspora in Latin America, especially in Brazil.

Year 2015 is the Latvian Presidency of the Council of the EU and will be a good platform to increase collaboration on political and economical aspects.

So let's support EU-LAC foundation initiative and implement activities that allow us:

- 1) to build a trust and Human to Human relationships;
- 2) to share information, experience and knowledge;
- 3) to find common aims;
- 4) to get to know each other more;
- 5) to create a strong network of triple helix parties between EU and LAC;
- 6) to implement common projects as result of factors mentioned previous.
